


Kia Ora Parents and Whanau,

In the Babies Room...

Over the past month we have had a strong focus on language development with an emphasis on learning the names of colours, shapes and animals. We have been encouraging speech through lots of songs, conversations and some new magnetic stories. We have found the Moreporks have particularly enjoyed colour recognition activities; even our younger room members have been participating, differentiating between a variety of colours and animals (pointing/ body language).

The Moreporks have also continued their sensory explorations, playing with gloop, paint and clay. Construction is also a popular interest, with our young architects being extremely creative with the materials they use for their towers!











In the Preschool Room...

'Promoting a love of Literacy' was our goal for the Month of March. The Kiwi, Tui and Flyers groups each explored literacy in different ways.

The Kiwi and Tui groups primarily focussed their learning around strengthening the children's confidence in recognising their names, starting with the first alphabet letter of their name and gradually learning to recognise the other letters within their names. For this they used stickers, blocks, paint, pastels, pens, plants (an alphabet garden), stamps and collage; to name a few materials. Each experience (although focusing on the same learning outcomes) was presented in a different way. The purpose of this is to promote engagement from everyone in the group, keeping things exciting and fresh while adapting to suit different styles of learning. One of the more active experiences even involved 'Alphabet Yoga'.

The Flyers also started with a focus on their own names but quickly progressed to also recognising each others names and sounding out/ spelling many different words. They participated in a variety of group games and challenges which promoted a sense of 'competitive fun'.
