# In the Babies Room...

The Moreporks have been extending upon their fine motor skills through exploring a variety of creative mediums.

The Moreporks have been using brushes, sticks, stamps (as well as their hands and fingers) to apply paint to paper. They have been utilizing their dexterity to sculpt clay and playdough into different shapes through pulling, pressing and poking the dough. They have also used different tools



with the dough such as rollers and shape cutters which also exercise hand-eye coordination.

Water play experiences are also a favorite activity amongst the group and they have been using cups, tea pots, jugs and an assortment of other vessels to transport, tip and pour water into different containment objects. It takes a great degree of control and focus not to spill the water, so this is a great challenge which really engages and captivates the children's interest.





# In the Preschool Room...

Our Preschool focus over the past month has been 'The Wonders of Nature'. The children have been observing the unique changes in our surrounding environment that occur around spring time as the weather warms. Visits to the orchard to care for our plants and to pick fruit have inspired the children's artworks and discussions.



Our teachers have been extending upon the children's interest by incorporating natural

materials into our group projects, the Flyers have been learning to weave using sticks, flax, flowers and stalks. The Tui group has been working on their ephemeral art compositions (making patterns with flowers and stones) and the Kiwis have been baking and making fruity Ice blocks with the fruit they pick from the orchard.

The children have also been planting seeds and are planning to plant some more herbs and vegetables in our gardens.
