In the Babies room...

This month the babies room has been focusing on transitions with many of our older babies turning into toddlers and new babies settling in. The outside environment is our current interest as we love to explore the garden to extend our gross motor skills.

Water play is a big part of that exploration with babies wanting to look after our plants by watering them with the hose (and themselves of course to cool off.) Ice is still a great activity giving children the opportunity to explore science concepts. They are mesmerised as they watch it slowly melt in the sunshine.

Teachers extend on children's learning by adding different mediums such as paint and sand to the melting ice. Children learn through all their senses. If you have any natural resources such as shells and driftwood that we could place in our garden please feel free to bring them in.





This month, wrapping up our 'Summer Holiday' focus, the children used their creative skills to collage and decorate the most delicious cold ice creams - some chose to make single scoop ice cream and some chose to make double scoop. We have recently just changed our focus to follow the children's interests, 'Dramatic Play'.

The Flyers love role playing with their friends. This is such a great form of expression which also strengthens their communication skills. Linking to this focus at group time some children have been thinking about how animals move and re-creating the movements themselves.







In the Preschool room...

In beginning of February we celebrated Waitangi Day. We drew up our own Fantails Flyers Treaty with 6 principles which we plan to adhere to, with the underlying theme of having respect for the environment and each other. We also all signed/wrote our names in the treaty document, to signify that we intend upholding our 6 principles.

We also had a Teddy Bears picnic day with everybody bringing their favourite soft toy to Fantails. We took ours to Silverdale primary school as part of our school walk and had lots of fun with them at the playground and in the library reading them stories.

We have also started an exciting new writing program with each child having their own journal to work in. They work individually with a teacher to support developing pencil skills, story-telling, sequencing and letter formation.



In the Toddlers room...

Our new focus involves construction play due to the majority of our children showing an interest in building with different materials and resources. Our teachers have been setting up the Lego, mega blocks and utilising spontaneous moments in the sandpit to discuss building and construction.

At mat time we are discussing and providing visual aids around the construction of the new development that is happening across the road. This supports the children's knowledge and understanding of the world around them, giving them the opportunity to make important connections with their community.

Our children are enjoying working alongside each—some taking turns driving Thomas the Tank Engine around the outside table while others make mud pies in the sandpit. With the hot weather we have been enjoying plenty of water play to stay nice and cool. We celebrated Waitangi Day by discussing respectful and kind choices we can make with our friends and family. The toddlers honoured this special day with the contribution of a wall display for our foyer depicting a waka with all the children in it. The symbolic behind this picture is that we all fit in and row/work together to achieve our goals together.





In the Juniors room...

At the beginning of the month we had a Teddy Bears' picnic. This was really enjoyed by the children who proudly brought their bears along to Fantails. What fun those bears had! There were many games that the bears join in including bouncing the teddies on the Lycra to see how high they could go. Our afternoon tea was a picnic with our teddies which carried on throughout this month. Each day the children would set up their picnic and invite their friends to join in, there was so much to do, with the children not only having food there but also games, books and toys to play with.

Extending on this interest, there has been a lot of talk about healthy food and the children have been learning about vegetables and fruit, making collage pictures, drawings and trying lots of different types of fruit and vegetables. Through these experiences the children are developing their social and emotional skills and also learning more about their own well-being.





Alongside that interest there has been a lot of transportation play. Children have been creating hot air balloons, fire trucks and boats. They have been building with blocks, construction sets, cardboard boxes and magnets and letting their imaginations go wild. This play supports their learning through trial and error as they work together to build, create and solve.
