



In the Toddlers room...

We have been interested in learning more about farm animals at our mat times through listening to books and magnetic stories. We have made this our new focus and have started to learn more about these animals through children's creative art.



This month we had bike day for all the rooms and the toddlers did very well at following the rules and riding around the marked out track. We are so lucky to be able to utilize our big carpark for these types of learning





opportunities for our children. This experience allows children to develop their gross motor skills while learning how to be safe on their bikes.

Easter was a great celebration. The children coloured in Easter egg templates and went on an exciting egg hunt, looking through our outdoor garden. Everyone was very happy when they found an egg! The children are learning about the wider world by celebrating this fun holiday.



Everyone got excited about Easter and Bike Day as we celebrated them on the same week. Bike Day was a huge success with everyone following the chalk road. There were all sorts of different coloured bikes and helmets and they all remembered the bike rules to keep safe. Easter was fantastic as we decorated bunnies and a big collage egg with an Easter chick popping out the top! The children made a lot of art work and of course the Easter egg hunt where the children got to search for chocolate Easter eggs to eat and take home was a highlight of the day!







In the Juniors Room...

Over the past month the Junior room went to 'Kiwi Valley' farm where the children had horse rides and got to hold and gently pat some guinea pigs, rabbits and rats. After that we all hopped on the trailer which was being towed by Farmer Jo on the tractor. We had a ride around some of the farm and saw sheep, cows, turkeys and pigs. Then we got to go on a trail walk feeding the animals and to end it off we went through an animal maze. The children learnt about the environment around them and gained confidence around animals and how to pat and feed them safely.





Through role play the children have continued to explore our topic 'All About Me' pretending to be teachers, princesses, family members and super heroes. Driven by their own interest different areas of the curriculum have mixed together, extending on their social skills such as turn taking, negotiating and problem solving. Play and learning has been extended as they navigate and identify their place in the group. The 'Dress Up' day extended this interest and helped grow the children's confidence in front of a group as they all paraded their much loved costumes along the 'Juniors' catwalk. Another way we are extending on this topic is through our focus on 'Helping Hands', where the children are learning to help one another.

In the Babies room...

Easter activities has kept us all busy with a variety of art works using different resources but the most exciting part was when we went on an Easter hunt searching in the garden for coloured plastic eggs which the children placed into the Easter basket.









Bike day was so much fun and as much as our babies love riding the bikes many preferred to climb on the equipment in the big playground further extending their gross motor skills.

We would like to welcome a number of new babies starting in the babies room many of whom are siblings. We have been so fortunate to have many children start in the babies room and then see them and their siblings go off to school at the end of their learning journey here at Fantails.



In the Preschool Room...

On Development Day at Silverdale Primary School we spent time in the reception classroom exploring all the activities and resources, as well as making Chinese lanterns and origami rabbits. Mrs Bassett-Smith spent some time talking about different cultures and language, especially Chinese and Japanese. The Flyers listened intently and also contributed to the discussion. We also spent time at the playground and in the library as we usually do. This helps children to become familiar with the school environment and prepares them for their transition to school.





For Easter we were busy making rice crispy eggs to put into the Easter egg baskets we have made for the Flyers to each take home. We also decorated our room with Easter bunnies everywhere.

With bike day there is lots of discussion about the different kinds of bikes that our Flyers own and are capable of riding. The Flyers were also practicing their bike skills on the bike path outside during the run up to bike day. When Bike Day arrived everyone turned up with their bikes and helmets, we had such a great time riding our bikes around the tennis courts and having bike races.

A big part of our month was going for our trip to 'Kiwi Valley' farm. The children all had an awesome time aetting there on the bus as we sana and played games. Once we got there we met some of the farm animals, along with rats, guinea pigs and rabbits. We also got to go for a ride on a trailer pulled by a tractor and had a horse ride. We all had lots of fun and got to explore a cave and a maze. A great day was had by all including all the parent helpers. Thank you for joining us!
